

In the process of the Dialogues, there have been a series of important achievements which allow us to measure the project's success to date.





### The Nature Conservancy's bold plan to save the world's oceans

Last April, TNC announced at TED in Vancouver, Canada, a plan to drastically

expand the conservation of oceans worldwide. With the delivery of blue bonds for ocean conservation in 20 countries over the next five years, TNC will help ensure the new protection of up to 1.5 million square miles (4 million km2) of the most crucial ocean habitats for the world's biodiversity — a 15 percent increase in the amount of protected ocean that currently exists.
